

Nearly 10 % of assignments were G grades (non-submission) including exams – 2015/16- 18/19








The proportion of students with a G grade reduces by level of study.

There is a larger ethnicity gap at level 3 than at level 6.







METHOD



Survey

- An open-ended survey was sent out to undergraduate students who had a non-submission in 21/22
- Over 3,000 students were sent a survey
- 178 responses (5.5%)
- Of these, 39 students were either foundation or first-year students

Interviews


4 foundation students were interviewed to provide greater depth of insight






DEMOGRAPHIC








The survey was representative of the non-submission students in terms of ethnicity







THOSE ANSWERING THE SURVEY WERE LESS LIKELY TO WITHDRAW FROM THEIR STUDIES






Please could you tell us why you couldn't meet the deadline for your assignment submission?






Why couldn't you meet the first deadline?

WHAT THE STUDENTS SAID:

"I tried catching up and I nearly caught but I just felt unmotivated and I didn't have any friends to ask questions and I felt like I couldn't go to class if I was behind."

"It was my fault completely, but i forgot that the deadline was on that day as i was focussing on other things going on in my life." "Due to work and family issues I didn't have enough time to complete it by the deadline and didn't want to ask for extension as I believed and tried my hardest to complete it by the dead line."



6 STUDENTS SELF-REPORTED MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES.

- No details all just stated mental health had not been good or mental health was an issue
- Unknown is diagnosed mental health or students struggling for a short period



WHAT HAVE STUDENTS DONE TO HELP THEMSELVES?





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
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Is there any additional help that would help you to meet your deadlines?

ATTEMPT AT FURTHER INSIGHTS

 We interviewed four foundation students to understand the circumstances further



FACTORS FROM INTERVIEWS

In support of survey:

- Time management
- Paid work commitments
- Prioritising social life/interests over grades
- Students were happy with the teaching support and lecturers but wanted staff to reach out to them

In addition:

- Multiple assessments with similar deadlines
- Students not wanting to submit substandard work
- Settling at uni can be a problem leading to lack of motivation





THIS IS JUST THE START...

- We want to develop interventions where we can have an effect time management and academic support
- Is there a debate about how much time students should have available to study and how clear is university communication about this?
