

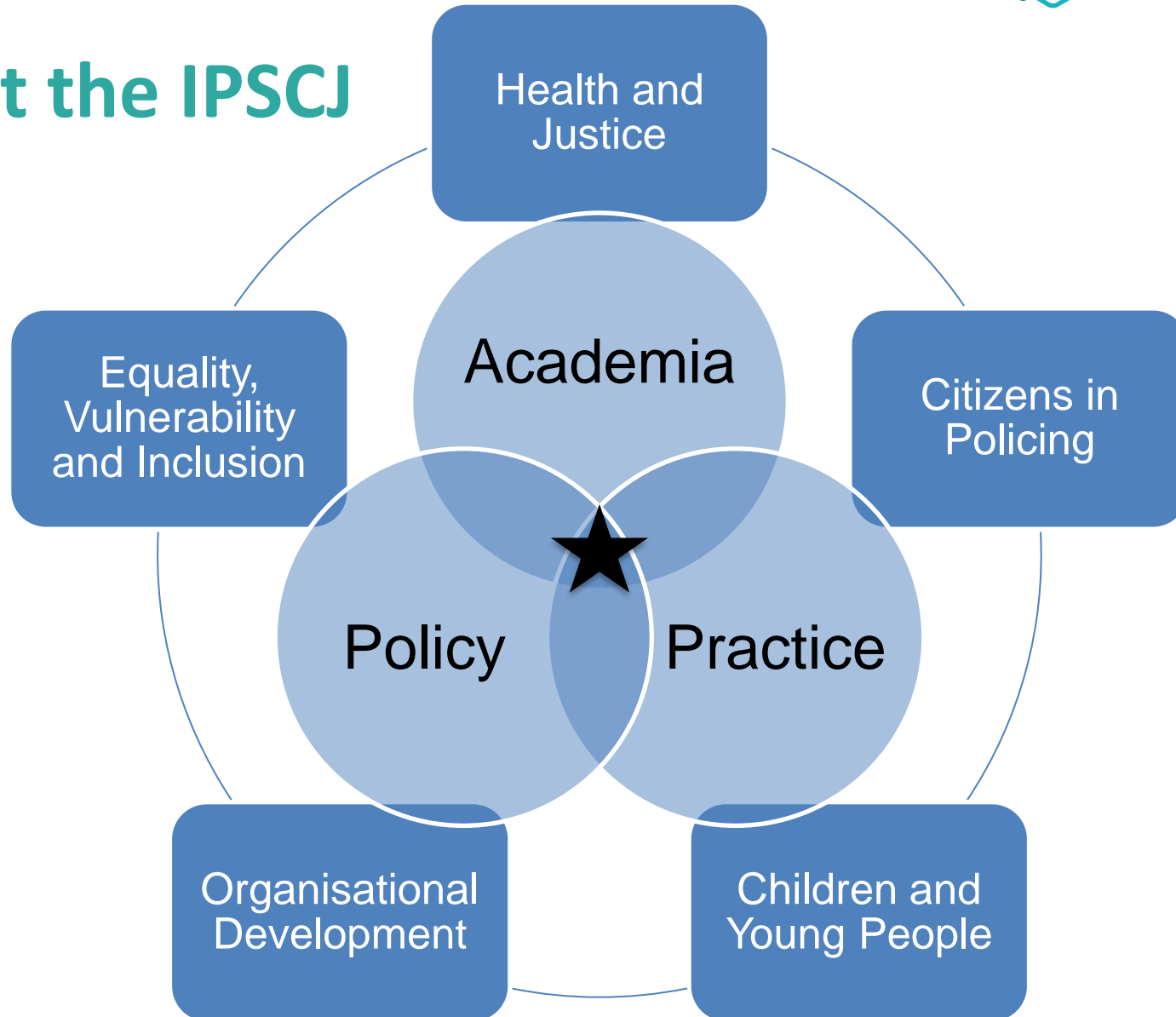

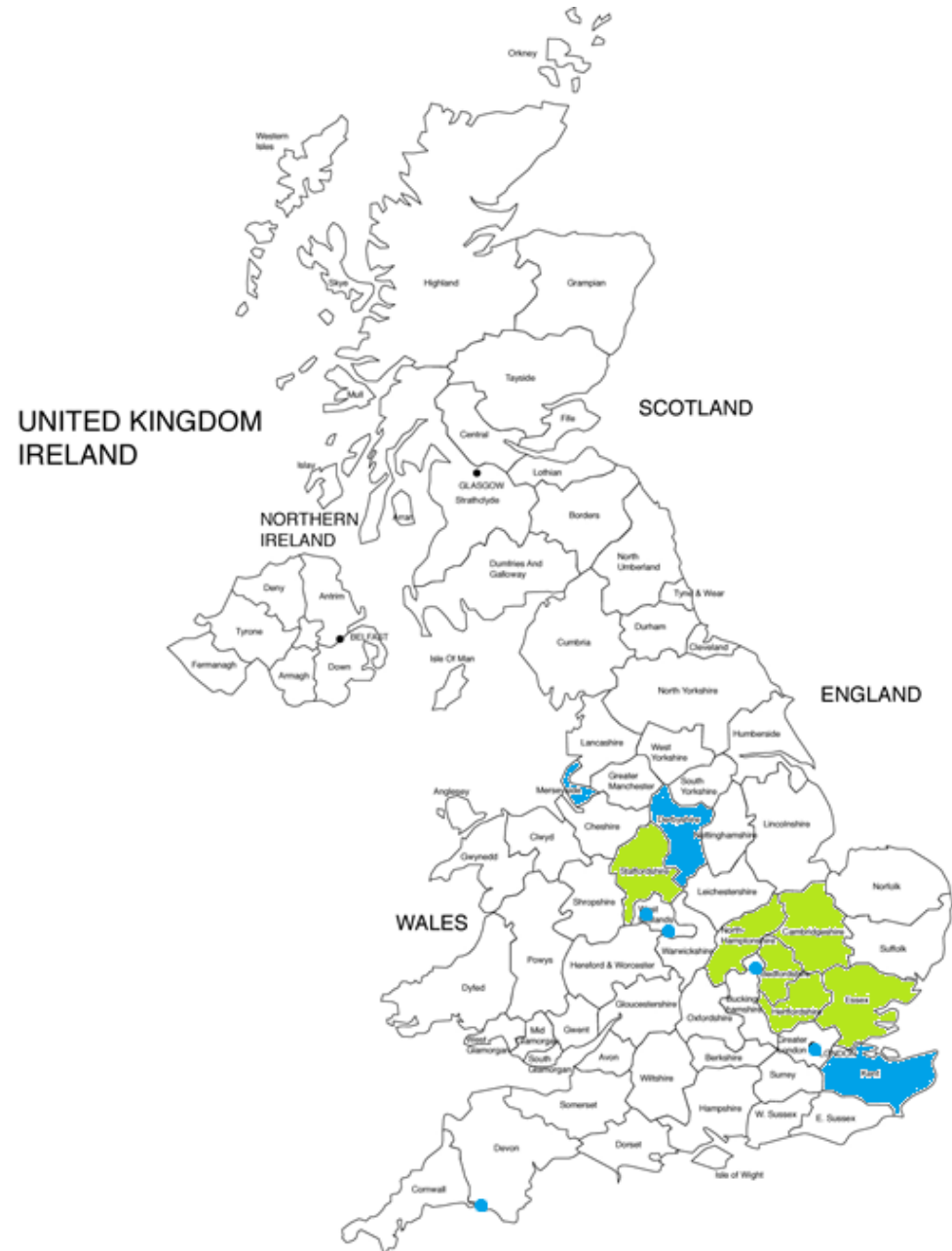


# Multisite Evaluation Opportunity

- Staffordshire



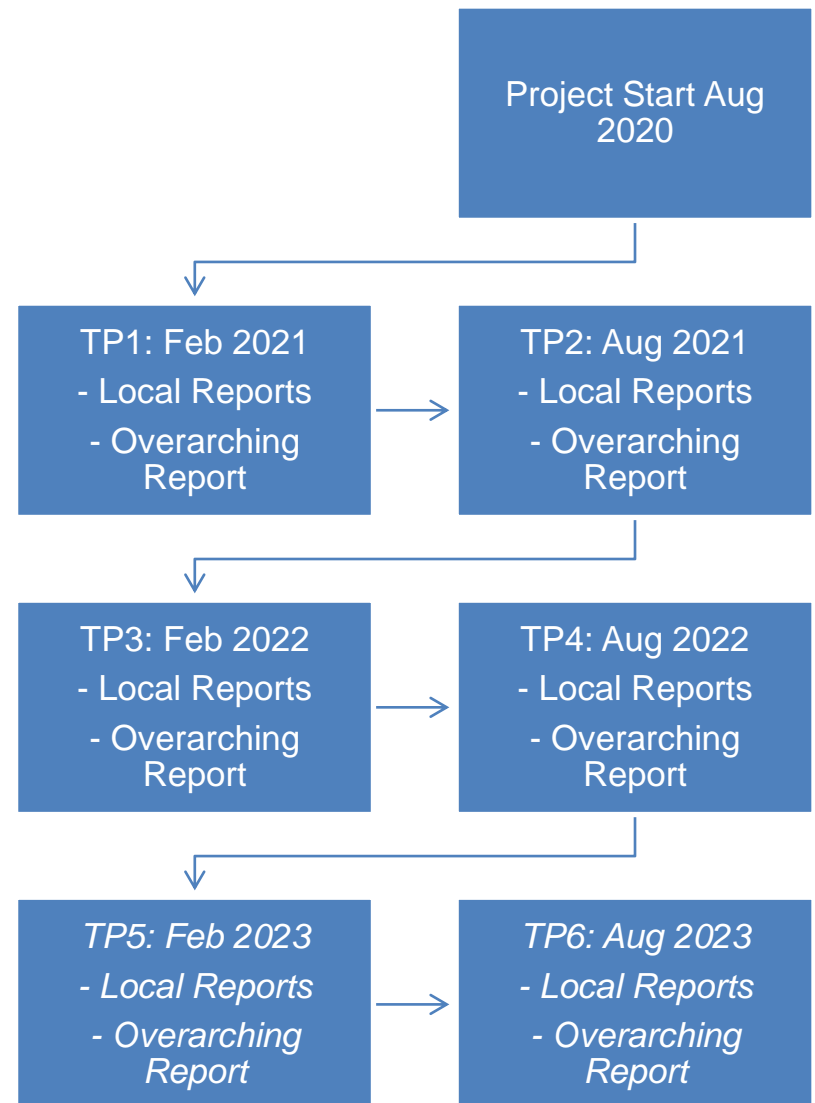
# Evaluation Activities

- Evaluation involves a range of activities:
  1. Interviews with individuals who receive MH interventions
    - a) Biographical, discussing events leading up to offence, assessment process, intervention and outlook
    - b) Selection to be agreed with sites but may focus on those completed and specific issues such as individuals who have breached or disengaged
  2. Interviews with professionals working across MHTR pathway
    - a) Identify local facilitators and barriers, to inform service development, and identify good practice



# Evaluation Timeline

- Overall 24-36 Months
- Reports produced every six months
- Local reports – bespoke comparisons
- Overarching – combined data from across sites
- Demographic differences
